# Key Challenges:

## Help The Needy Charitable Trust's in 2024-2025

The past year was marked by profound hardship and human suffering. Catastrophic Floods in Pakistan left entire communities in ruins. At the same time, global inflation deepened poverty across regions, restricting access to essentials like food, healthcare, and education, especially among the world's most vulnerable.

In Pakistan, economic turmoil hit low-income families the hardest. Soaring living costs, rising unemployment, and collapsing social safety nets left millions, particularly women, children, and the elderly, struggling to survive.

### Our Response: Compassion in Action

Amid the growing challenges faced by vulnerable communities across Pakistan, **Help The Needy Charitable** acted with compassion and commitment to support those most in need.

Across different communities in Pakistan, we delivered essential humanitarian assistance with care, dignity, and responsibility.

In Pakistan, we strengthened and expanded our community support programmes including:

- **Food Assistance and Ramadan Support** to help vulnerable families meet their basic nutritional needs
- **Rozgar and Women Empowerment** initiatives to support livelihood stability and financial independence
- **Clean Water and Health Support** initiatives to improve well-being and uphold dignity
- **Community-led initiatives** that promote resilience, sustainability, and self-reliance

Every intervention reflects our unwavering commitment to compassion, transparency, and empowering communities across Pakistan.

### Beyond Relief: Tackling the Roots of Poverty

Our efforts went further than just emergency relief. We worked to amplify the voices of marginalised communities and drive advocacy aimed at addressing systemic inequalities. We believe meaningful change begins when we listen, understand, and stand together to challenge the causes of injustice, not just its symptoms.

### The Road Ahead: Hope, Justice, and Collaboration

The world is changing fast, but for too many, it's not changing for the better. Unless bold, compassionate reforms are made to expand access to livelihoods, education, and healthcare, millions will remain trapped in cycles of poverty. This is a moral and collective challenge.

At Al-Wahab Foundation, we remain rooted in hope and action. Together with our partners, donors, and communities, we are striving to build a future defined not by crisis, but by compassion, opportunity, and justice for all.



# Water for Life

At Help The Needy Charitable Trust, we understand that access to clean water is fundamental to sustaining life, improving health, and ensuring overall well-being. That is why we are dedicated to implementing sustainable water projects that bring safe and reliable water sources to communities in need.

With your support this year, we have been able to make a life-changing impact. Through donating water wells and hand pumps, we have been able to help provide clean, safe water to vulnerable communities and protect them from preventable illnesses.

## Pakistan's Water Crisis:

During the past few years, it has become evident that water scarcity remains a critical issue in Pakistan. Approximately 40% of the population has reliable access to safe drinking water, leaving millions vulnerable to the consequences of unclean and insufficient water sources.

At Help The Needy Charitable Trust, our highest priority is to ensure that marginalised and vulnerable communities have reliable access to clean drinking water—protecting health and preserving life.

Through our 'Water for Life' initiative, we have taken significant strides to meet the immediate needs of those affected by water scarcity while also addressing the root causes of water contamination.



This includes the implementation of sustainable, well-maintained water pumps and the construction of water wells in key community locations. Through our partnership with Al-Wahab Foundation (UK), Masjid Falah-e-Daraine (France), London Central Mosque Trust and Islamic

Cultural Center (UK) we initially worked to install 48 water wells and 831 hand pumps across various regions in Pakistan, bringing clean water to 12,000 people through water wells and benefiting an additional 20,775 individuals through hand pump installations. The water infrastructure has been established in

some of the most impoverished areas of Pakistan, including: Khipro, Khai, Shah Sikanderbad, Achro Thar, Jamrao, Dera, Dilyar, Chotiyarian, Gujri (Sanghar), Bhan, Dadu, Pipri, Khudabad, Allahabad, Monder (Dadu). Our implementation process is underpinned by rigorous field

assessments and community engagement, ensuring that installations are strategically placed in areas with the greatest need. These water solutions are not only restoring health and dignity but also bringing long-term impact to families and entire villages across Pakistan.



# Building Masjids, Strengthening Communities


In places where resources are scarce and daily life is a struggle, the presence of a Masjid brings more than just a space to pray, it brings hope, dignity, and unity. A Masjid becomes a centre for spiritual growth, education, and community life. It is where hearts turn to Allah (SWT), and where Islamic values are passed down through generations.

At Help The Needy Charitable Trust, we deeply understand the sacred importance of these spaces. That is why our Build a Masjid initiative focuses on constructing Masjids in the most neglected and rural areas, where communities often lack the means to build one themselves.

With careful planning, high-quality materials, and close collaboration with local communities, we ensure every Masjid is not just a building, but a lasting spiritual landmark that uplifts and unites the people it serves.

## Masjid Projects in Pakistan

Between 2024 and 2025, Help The Needy Charitable Trust completed 39 Masjids in Pakistan, providing spaces for worship, learning, and community gathering to more than 4,560 people.



In collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, we constructed 39 Masjids in District Sanghar, District Dadu in the Sindh Region and Chitruk in Khayber Pakhtunkhwa Region. These communities, previously lacking dedicated prayer spaces, now benefit from vibrant and welcoming Masjids designed to serve their spiritual and social needs.

Our dedicated team continues to enhance the design and quality of every Masjid we build. Each structure is developed with attention to both functionality and aesthetics, and our donors have expressed great satisfaction with the beautiful and lasting impact of these sacred spaces.

## The Lasting Impact of Our Masjid Project

In Pakistan Help The Needy Charitable Trust in a collaboration with Al Wahab Foundation built a total of 39 Masjids between 2024 and 2025, collectively benefiting around 4,500 people. These achievements were made possible by the generosity of our donors and the dedication of our teams on the ground.

As we look to the future, we remain committed to expanding this life-changing programme. With every Masjid we build, we are not simply creating structures. We are strengthening faith, reviving communities, and preserving Islamic heritage for generations to come.



# Serving Hope:

## Food Packs and Cooked Meals for Those in Need

At Help The Needy Charitable Trust, we are deeply committed to addressing food insecurity and standing in solidarity with vulnerable communities through our Feed the Hungry initiative. Guided by compassion and purpose, we deliver essential food aid to families in crisis, offering not just sustenance, but renewed hope and dignity in the face of hardship.

With your continued support, we aim to ensure that no one is left behind in the fight against hunger.

In Pakistan food scarcity is more than a temporary issue. It continuously fuels the cycle of poverty for those who are desperately trying to escape such conditions.

Through its food packs distribution programme, Help The Needy Charitable Trust supports families in need by providing monthly food packs containing essential food staples. These packs include vital items such as rice, flour, sugar, lentils, and oil or ghee, helping to alleviate food insecurity and ensure families have access to basic nutritional needs.

Between July 2024 and June 2025, our team distributed 490 carefully curated food packs out of which 450 food packs were from Zakat, each designed to sustain a family of ten for an entire month, reaching 4,900 individuals across Pakistan.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, 490 packs were delivered across various regions in Pakistan, including Achro Thar and Chitral, benefiting 4,900 people. With support from Al-Wahab Foundation

These efforts reflect our unwavering commitment to fighting hunger and restoring dignity to vulnerable communities, with continued plans to expand this vital initiative.



## Food Packs



Through our cooked food programme, donors have enabled Help The Needy Charitable Trust to serve freshly prepared meals to the most vulnerable.

In Pakistan, the situation has been further exacerbated by prolonged economic hardship. In these conditions, many families struggle to access even a single hot meal each day. To address this urgent need, our efforts have been geared towards focusing on remote and underserved communities, where access to essential food is severely limited. With the support of local communities, our team has been able to carefully assess and prioritise those in greatest need.

A total of 113 cooked meals were distributed, benefitting 6,250 individuals. These include Burmi Colony, Surjani Town, Kalapul, Malir, Karnal Colony, Mangopeer, Gadap Town (Karachi) and Chitral (KPK). These included 24 pots of cooked meals served during religious gatherings and Qur'an recitations, 39 pots of Qurbani meals on Eid ul-Adha, and 50 pots delivered during the month of Muharram.

Through this initiative, we have been able to provide nourishment to a total of 6,250 individuals between July 2024 and June 2025. Your continued support is instrumental in transforming hunger into hope for thousands.

# Rozgar Project:

## Creating Sustainable Livelihoods

Launched in 2015, the Rozgar Project is one of Help The Needy Charitable Trust flagship projects, designed to tackle poverty at its root by enabling long-term economic empowerment. In a country where nearly 24% of the population lives below the poverty line, millions of families face ongoing struggles due to limited infrastructure, high unemployment, and restricted access to resources, particularly in remote and underserved areas.

Between July 2024 and June 2025, the Rozgar Project successfully distributed 15 auto rickshaws and 20 motorbikes (1 Auto Rickshaw and 2 Bikes from Zakat) to deserving individuals across Hyderabad, Dadu, and Karachi. These essential vehicles are more than assets, they are lifelines that provide recipients with stable employment, reliable income, and a renewed sense of purpose. This phase of the project directly benefited an estimated 480 individuals, including family members who now enjoy improved household stability and economic uplift.

The Rozgar Project continues to exemplify our vision of poverty alleviation through sustainable solutions. By focusing on economic empowerment, we are not just meeting temporary needs; we are investing in futures, rebuilding livelihoods, and helping communities thrive from the ground up. This initiative is carried out in collaboration with the Al-Wahab Foundation, whose partnership and support strengthen our shared commitment to empowering individuals and creating long-term opportunities for communities in need.



# Empowering Women

## Through Sustainable Livelihood Opportunities



We believe that empowering women is fundamental to creating lasting social and economic transformation within certain communities. One of the cornerstones of this effort is our Women Empowerment Project. This project focuses on enabling women from disadvantaged backgrounds to become economically self-sufficient, by providing them with the tools and confidence needed to empower them to become agents of change within their households and beyond.



This project has concentrated on providing sewing machines to women from underprivileged backgrounds, enabling them to strengthen their tailoring skills and establish sustainable sources of income from the comfort and safety of their homes. In the 2024–2025 period, Help The Needy Charitable Trust in a collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation successfully distributed 250 sewing machines to women across suburban areas of Karachi, including Kalapul and Surjani Town. This effort has directly empowered these women to pursue independent livelihoods,



positively impacting an estimated 250 beneficiaries including family members and communities. In these 250 Machine 50 were distributed from Zakat Account.

All applicants undergo a thorough selection and screening process to ensure that this support reaches those most in need. Many of the recipients live in areas where cultural and logistical barriers limit their ability to work outside the home. By offering them an opportunity to earn from within their households, the initiative breaks down these barriers while encouraging a sense of resilience and self-sufficiency.

# Restoring Vision:

## Through Eye Care Initiatives

The gift of sight is one of the most transformative forms of support we can provide. At Help The Needy Charitable Trust, we believe that no one should suffer from preventable blindness simply because they live in poverty.

In Pakistan, the most common causes of blindness—cataracts and refractive errors—are both treatable, yet they continue to affect thousands of people in low-income communities who lack access to proper medical care.

Through our Eye Care Programme, implemented in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, we are committed to restoring sight and preventing further vision loss by providing access to essential eye treatments, consultations, and awareness on eye health. Our services support both children and the elderly, ensuring that people at every stage of life receive the care they need to protect their vision and reconnect with the world around them.



# Cataract Surgeries:

## Restoring Sight, Restoring Dignity

During this fiscal year, with the generous support of our donors and in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, Help The Needy Charitable Trust successfully facilitated 1,050 cataract surgeries across Pakistan. These procedures enabled 1,050 individuals to regain not only their vision but also their independence, confidence, and overall quality of life.

Through the generosity of our supporters, we were able to ensure that patients received a dignified and seamless experience throughout the treatment process. Every aspect of patient care was thoughtfully arranged to reduce the burden on vulnerable individuals and their families.

Patients were provided with safe and reliable transportation to and from hospitals, ensuring they could access essential treatment without additional financial hardship. On the day of surgery, beneficiaries were also provided with nutritious cooked meals to offer comfort and strength during their procedures.

In addition, specialised surgical equipment and hygiene kits were arranged to support high standards of medical care and infection prevention. Patients undergoing cataract surgeries were also facilitated with free pick-and-drop services, ensuring their safety, comfort, and accessibility to treatment.

Our teams also visited various eye care camps and partner hospitals in underserved communities, including areas such as Orangi Town, Landhi, and District Dadu, where many individuals lack access to proper eye care services. These visits allowed our teams to connect directly with beneficiaries and ensure that those most in need received timely treatment and support.

These efforts reflect our shared commitment with Al-Wahab Foundation to restoring sight, dignity, and hope for vulnerable individuals, while continuing to expand access to life-changing eye care services for underserved communities across Pakistan.

## Eye Camps

As part of our commitment to accessible healthcare and addressing visual impairment, Help The Needy Charitable Trust, in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, organises Eye Care Camps that provide free eye consultations and treatment to individuals who lack access to basic eye care services. These camps are staffed by experienced and qualified medical professionals who conduct thorough eye examinations, provide accurate diagnoses, and prescribe essential medications and corrective eyewear—entirely free of charge.

Between July 2024 and June 2025, a total of 40 Eye Camps were organised in underserved areas including New Karachi, Surjani Town, Gadap Town, Orangi Town, Landhi, Gulshan-e-Maymar, Baldia Town, Korangi (Karachi), Dadu (Sindh), and Winder (Balochistan). Out of these 40 Camps, 20 Camps from Zakat account. During this period, we successfully screened and treated 11,085 beneficiaries, providing routine eye check-ups,

distributing medications, and issuing referrals for further hospital-based care where advanced treatment was required.

Due to the overwhelming response and growing need for eye care services in underserved communities, efforts are being made to continue organising regular eye camps each year to ensure that as many individuals as possible receive timely eye examinations and treatment.

Our Eye Care Camps play a vital role in reducing the burden of preventable blindness and improving health outcomes among vulnerable communities. By restoring and protecting vision, these initiatives empower individuals to regain their independence, enhance their quality of life, and return to work, education, and daily activities with renewed confidence and dignity.



# The Spirit of Ramadan

## A Month of Mercy and Giving

Ramadan is a sacred month of spiritual reflection, compassion, and unity—values that lie at the heart of Help The Needy Charitable Trust’s mission. Each year, we strive to embody the true spirit of this blessed month by delivering meaningful support to communities in need across Pakistan, helping families observe Ramadan with dignity, peace, and ease. This initiative is carried out in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, strengthening our shared commitment to serving those most in need.



We recognise that fasting during Ramadan is a deeply spiritual act of devotion, reflection, and self-discipline. However, for many vulnerable individuals and families, the lack of access to essential food items for Suhoor and Iftar can make this sacred time challenging. At Help The Needy Charitable Trust, we are dedicated to supporting those in need—ensuring that no one is left behind during this blessed month.



Our annual Ramadan Project remains a key part of our humanitarian efforts. With the generous support of our local and international donors, we provide essential food assistance to families facing financial hardship across different communities in Pakistan. Through the distribution of Ramadan Food Packs, we aim to help households meet their basic needs during the holy month and observe Ramadan with comfort and dignity.



Through our partnership with Al-Wahab Foundation and the continued generosity of our supporters, we are able to expand the reach of this initiative and deliver relief where it is needed most. Together, we continue to uphold the values of generosity, compassion, and solidarity—ensuring that the blessings of Ramadan are shared with all, especially those who need them most.



## Food Packs

Each Ramadan pack is thoughtfully curated to sustain a family of six for the entire month. It includes key food items such as flour, rice, lentils, sugar, tea, oil or ghee, pasta, cereal, dates, vermicelli, salt, and spices. Between the time period of July 2024 and June 2025, we distributed 1,839 Ramadan food packs in Pakistan, directly supporting approximately 18,390 individuals. Through a valued partnership with Al-Wahab Foundation (UK), London Central Mosque Trust and Islamic Cultural Center (UK), Masjid Falah-e-Daraine (France) we provided 1,839 Food Packs during the month of Ramadan in 2025 benefitting 18,390 individuals.



## Iftar Distributions:

Help The Needy Charitable Trust, in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, also organises Iftar distributions throughout Ramadan to support individuals who may be away from home, facing hardship, or unable to afford a proper meal to break their fast. In 2025, we provided 2,090 Iftar packs across Pakistan, ensuring that many people were able to end their fast with dignity and nourishment. Each Iftar pack is thoughtfully prepared and includes items such as dates, fruits, biryani, water, juice, and fried delicacies like samosas and pakoras. These meals are distributed in communities where many individuals struggle to arrange Iftar during the holy month. Our Ramadan initiatives aim not only to provide nourishment but also to strengthen the spirit of compassion and community during this sacred time. Thanks to the generosity of our local and international supporters, 2,090 Iftar packs were distributed across Pakistan—serving as a powerful reminder of the empathy, generosity, and unity that define Ramadan and continue to guide our mission.

# Through Eid Gift Distribution

Every child deserves to experience the joy and celebration of Eid, regardless of their circumstances. As part of our Ramadan outreach, Help The Needy Charitable Trust extended its support beyond food assistance to include initiatives that uplift hearts and restore a sense of dignity during this blessed time. This initiative was carried out in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation and Masjid Falah-e-Daraine (France), strengthening our shared commitment to supporting vulnerable communities.

In 2025, we distributed 117 Eid Gift Packs to children from underprivileged families across Pakistan, enabling them to celebrate Eid with happiness and pride. Each thoughtfully prepared pack included items tailored to the children's needs: new clothes and shoes for boys, and dresses, bangles, and accessories for girls.

These gifts allowed children to feel included, valued, and joyful alongside their peers, reinforcing a meaningful sense of belonging. Through the generosity of our partners and supporters, we were able to bring smiles to many young faces and ensure that the spirit of Eid was shared with those who needed it most.



# Qurbani:

## Bringing Blessings to Those in Need

Eid al-Adha is a sacred occasion during which Muslims around the world commemorate the devotion of Prophet Ibrahim (AS) by performing the act of Qurbani—a reflection of obedience, faith, and compassion. Observed on the 10th, 11th, and 12th of Dhul Hijjah, this spiritual practice not only fulfils a religious duty but also serves as a powerful means of supporting those most in need.

Help The Needy Charitable Trust, in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation (UK), London Central Mosque Trust and Islamic Cultural Center (UK), Masjid Falah-e-Daraine (France) is dedicated to ensuring that the blessings of Qurbani reach impoverished and underserved communities across Pakistan. With the generous support of our local and international donors, we


carefully source, transport, and distribute Qurbani meat as well as cooked food to families who may otherwise be unable to share in the joy of Eid.

In Dhul Hijjah 2025, we successfully reached 36,416 beneficiaries, distributing meat from 208 lambs, 116 goats, 59 cows, and 13 camels. Every sacrificial animal was carefully selected to meet Shariah-compliant health and safety standards, ensuring that the Qurbani process was conducted with integrity and in accordance with Islamic principles. Our teams also supervised the sacrificial procedures to ensure that all practices were performed properly and respectfully.

The meat was distributed across several communities in Pakistan, including Wangi Goth, Sohail Goth, Gulzarabad, Umer Goth, Kherabad, Surjani

Town, Malir Town, Jhelum, and other underserved areas. For many families, this was their only opportunity during the year to enjoy a nutritious meal during the blessed days of Eid.

In addition, our teams prepared and distributed 32 pots of cooked food, benefiting 1,600 individuals through the Qurbani Project 2025. We believe every Muslim should be able to celebrate Eid al-Adha with dignity. Through the continued generosity of our supporters, this initiative transforms an act of faith into a shared moment of joy, unity, and compassion—touching the lives of thousands and reflecting the true spirit of Eid.

## Zakat Distribution

From underserved communities across Pakistan to families struggling with hunger and poverty, Zakat donations to Help The Needy Charitable Trust, in collaboration with Nabi Qasim Industries Pvt Ltd, have empowered over 3,000 beneficiaries between 2024 and 2025. These contributions supported vital initiatives including eye care services, the distribution of food packs, and sustainable livelihood support through the Rozgar Project.

Zakat, one of the five pillars of Islam, is more than an act of charity—it is a powerful means of promoting economic justice, compassion, and community upliftment. At Help The Needy Charitable Trust, we uphold this sacred responsibility with the highest level of care and transparency, ensuring that every Zakat donation is utilised in accordance with Islamic principles to support vulnerable individuals and restore dignity to those in need.





## Wheelchair Distribution Project

An important component of our humanitarian efforts is restoring mobility and dignity to individuals with physical disabilities through our Wheelchair Distribution Project. Help The Needy Charitable Trust, in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, successfully implemented this initiative with the generous support of our valued donors to assist vulnerable individuals across Pakistan. During the reporting period of July 2024 to June 2025, a total of 50 wheelchairs were distributed to individuals facing mobility challenges. These beneficiaries included elderly persons, people with disabilities, and those recovering from injuries, many of whom had limited or no access to proper mobility aids

## Solar Project

An important part of our development initiatives is promoting sustainable solutions through our Solar Energy Support Project. Help The Needy Charitable Trust, in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, implemented this initiative with the generous support of our valued donors to assist underserved communities in Pakistan.

During the reporting period of July 2024 to June 2025, a total of 23 solar units were installed, benefiting 230 individuals from vulnerable households living in areas with limited or no access to reliable electricity. These solar solutions provided a clean, safe, and cost-effective source of energy for daily use. This initiative significantly improved the quality of life for beneficiaries by enabling lighting in homes, supporting children's education after dark, and reducing dependence on expensive and harmful fuel sources. Beyond its practical impact, the project also promoted environmental sustainability and long-term resilience, reflecting our commitment to empowering communities and fostering a brighter, more self-reliant future.



## Fulfilling a Sacred Duty

Zakat is not merely a charitable option, it is a religious obligation and one of the fundamental tenets of Islam, ordained by Allah to ensure justice, equity, and care for the most vulnerable members of society. As Allah says in the Qur'an: "Take from their wealth a charity by which you purify them and cause them increase..." (Surah At-Tawbah 9:103)

When managed with sincerity and precision, Zakat becomes a transformative tool for poverty alleviation, wealth redistribution, and spiritual purification.

Help The Needy Charitable Trust is honoured to help Muslims fulfil their duty of giving Zakat by channelling it towards providing essential food aid and winter support, enabling access to life-changing eye care facilities, and empowering families through sustainable livelihood opportunities.

## Responsible and Transparent a

Help The Needy Charitable Trust is committed to responsible and transparent Zakat distribution, ensuring every donation is handled with accountability and compassion. All Zakat funds are directed exclusively to eligible recipients in accordance with Shariah guidelines, allocated to projects that deliver meaningful humanitarian impact, and managed through transparent systems that uphold our 100% Zakat donation policy. Our Zakat-supported programmes include Eye Care initiatives offering free consultations, cataract surgeries, and treatments through Eye Care Camps; Food Security efforts through the distribution of Food Packs and Cooked Meals; Livelihood Support via the Rozgar Project, which equips individuals with tools to earn a dignified income; and Emergency Relief, including the provision of Winter Kits during periods of extreme hardship.

# Sadaqah’s Impact: Uplifting Lives Through Charity

## What is Sadaqah?

Sadaqah, the voluntary act of charity in Islam, reflects the sincerity, compassion, and generosity that lies at the heart of our faith. Unlike Zakat, which is a compulsory obligation, Sadaqah can be offered at any time, in any amount, and in countless forms. The role of Sadaqah in Islam is deeply rooted in prophetic tradition. The Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W) said, “Charity does not decrease wealth” (Sahih Muslim). It purifies one’s wealth and soul, offering protection from calamity while reinforcing a sense of shared humanity. Sadaqah is not limited by income, status, or circumstance. It is accessible to all and beneficial to all. Every act of giving, no matter how small, is recognised and rewarded by Allah (SWT)

## Monetary Sadaqah: Meeting Urgent & Ongoing Needs

One of the most impactful forms of Sadaqah is monetary charity, as it enables a rapid response to emergencies while also supporting communities facing ongoing hardship. At Help The Needy Charitable Trust, in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, monetary Sadaqah has played a vital role in assisting individuals and families affected by poverty, illness, and financial instability. During this reporting period, our Sadaqah Fund directly benefited an estimated 3,370 people in need. Through these generous contributions, we were able to provide medical assistance to patients unable to afford treatment, support individuals through sustainable livelihood initiatives, and distribute food packs to families experiencing hunger. In addition, donations helped support clean water solutions in communities lacking safe access and contributed to the construction and renovation of Masjids, strengthening both the physical and spiritual foundations of the communities we serve. These initiatives not only addressed urgent needs but also helped build resilience, restore dignity, and support long-term wellbeing for vulnerable families across Pakistan.



## Sadaqah Animal Sacrifice

An important part of our Sadaqah programme is the facilitation of Sadaqah through animal sacrifice. Help The Needy Charitable Trust, in collaboration with Al-Wahab Foundation, carried out this initiative with the support of our valued donors to benefit vulnerable communities in Pakistan.



During this reporting period, 11 goats were sacrificed, and the meat was distributed among 528 individuals from underserved families. For many of the recipients, this was one of the few opportunities during the year to enjoy such nutritious food.



Beyond providing physical nourishment, this initiative also represented compassion, inclusion, and the strong spiritual connection between donors and beneficiaries, reflecting the true spirit of Sadaqah and community care

My name is Abdullah, and I am a resident of New Karachi. For more than five years, I struggled with serious vision problems, but I could not afford even a basic eye examination. I later learned about a free eye camp organised by Help The Needy Charitable Trust in collaboration with Falah-e-Daraine (France), in our area, and I decided to attend for a check-up. During the screening, I was diagnosed with a cataract that required surgery.

With the support of both organisations, my cataract surgery was arranged completely free of cost. They also provided transportation, meals, and assistance throughout the entire process, ensuring that everything was handled with great care and respect.

Today, I can see clearly again and return to my daily life with confidence. I am deeply grateful to Help The Needy Charitable Trust and Al-Wahab Foundation for restoring my eyesight and bringing hope back into my life. May Allah reward everyone who supported this effort and helped give me the precious gift of sight.



## Your Qurbani Brought Joy to My Family – **Saleem**

My name is Saleem. I live with my wife Zareena and our nine children in a remote part of Sindh. I work as a mercenary and am the only one earning. No matter how hard I try, it's tough to feed my family.

We often go without proper meals, and meat is something we simply can't afford. But on Eid Al-Adha, when we receive Qurbani meat from Help The Needy Charitable Trust, it's a blessing. We cook, store, and savour it over a few days, it brings real happiness to our home. I thank the Help The Needy Charitable Trust from the bottom of my heart. 


